




31st Annual Statewide CARD Conference - January 12-14, 2023

CARD Conference Information



The Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule 2 (ADOS 2) has become the standard Instrument for assessing ASD across age, developmental level, and language skills. Participants will learn how to use the ADOS 2 in clinical practice to assess and diagnose autism. This 2-day live workshop teaches, through instruction and live demonstration, how to use the ADOS-2 to clinically assess and diagnose autism.

DESCRIPTION

A combination of lecture, live demonstration, video presentation, and discussion will allow participants to practice scoring while observing the instructor administering the ADOS 2.





Make Your Holidays Bright - Webinar Recap

Holidays can bring lots of excitement and fun, new activities. However, these changes could also bring uneasiness and unpredictability for those with autism.

Changes That Occur

How It Can be Difficult for Autistic People

Rushing around, short tempers

No School

Decorations

Extended family

Trips to visit family

Multiple holiday events/gathering

Adults are stressed

Unstructured time, not routine
Different sights, sounds & smells
Unfamiliar people, crowds
Strange places, different routines
Unfamiliar environments, expectations & clothing

Thinking about these changes, here are some strategies to ease into the holiday season and prepare for joy!

<u>Use the "Prime-Time-Show" Strategy:</u>

PRIME – Prepare for the holidays by:

- · Talking about changes in school and family schedules.
- Looking at photos, videos, and virtual tours of new and old places you will visit.
- Talking with family you will visit about the needs your child may have.

TIME – Explain changes in schedules by:

- Using a calendar to visually show schedule changes (try color-coding, highlighting, etc.).
- Attaching photos of people you will see on specific calendar days.
- · Talking about and crossing off days as they happen.
- Considering "down time" each day with a quiet spot even at others' homes.

SHOW – Make it visual by:

- Using first/then boards and visual schedules to show what's coming up.
- Using social narratives and bringing them on trips for review.
- · Role-playing situations and possible interactions with others.

FSU CARD staff had the opportunity to participate in a "Social Security 101" training facilitated by Molly Sullivan, senior associate, with Griffin-Hammis Associates. Molly provided the team with invaluable information about two cash benefits administered by Social Security Administration (SSA): SSI (Supplemental Security Income) and SSDI (Social Security Disability Insurance).
